Annual Conference 2018: "Quite simply, we are here for our members"

This was the opening message from your National Chair Calum Macleod (pictured above) to the 1000-strong audience of Federation

representatives at our [94th Annual Conference](#), held in Birmingham last month: "We are here so that members voices can be heard," he continued. "We all have a duty to represent our members; to air their concerns; to seek solutions on their behalf and to challenge where challenge is needed."

During his keynote speech the following day, in the presence of the new Home Secretary Sajid Javid, Mr Macleod warned Mr Javid that [he must "learn the lessons his predecessors failed to"](#). Your National Chair spoke of our frustration when it comes to changes in legislation in relation to assaults on emergency workers and trained police drivers, and urged the government to take the opportunity to make a difference.

Mr Macleod also highlighted the issue of poor officer pay, and the increasing disconnect between the demand and capacity facing the police service. A [hard-hitting video depicting some of the many issues faced by police officers on the frontline](#) day in, day out featured as part of the address.

A 'cautious welcome' for police drivers' consultation

Following continued pressure from us, the [Home Office has launched a consultation on proposals to amend the legislation on careless and dangerous driving](#) to recognise the high level of training and skill possessed by trained police drivers. The consultation also aims to clarify the situation for those of you who pursue motorcyclists, and will also ask for views as to whether the changes should also apply to police response driving. It is unacceptable to expose officers to prosecution merely for doing their job.

Police and Crime Commissioners to present to Mr Hurd the evidence he needs to make the case for increasing government spending in policing.



There's a 'gaping hole' in the new counter-terrorism strategy

Calum Macleod, your National Chair, said: "[Nowhere in this new Home Office strategy is there any mention of extra money for the police](#) to put extra boots on the ground, when we already know neighbourhood policing is key in combatting terrorism. Over the past few years, we have lost 3,500 neighbourhood officers - there are now only around 19,200 left. We know the Home Secretary doesn't intend to revisit police funding until the next Spending Review at the end of 2019. But that's too late."

[British cosmetic company 'Lush' have launched a damaging and distasteful campaign](#) claiming to 'unravel the truth of undercover policing'. Calum Macleod, your National Chair, said: "The Lush advertising campaign is offensive, disgusting and an insult to the hard work, professionalism and dedication of police officers throughout the UK." We are joining forces with the Federations of Scotland and Northern Ireland to write an open letter to the Advertising Standards Authority to ask them to take action.
